Most difficult: 75% of freshmen were in top 10% of high school class and scored over 29 on ACT. 30% or fewer of all applicants accepted.

Very difficult: more than 75% of freshmen were in top 10% of high school class and scored over 26 on ACT. 60% or fewer applicants accepted

Moderately difficult: more than 75% of freshmen were in top 50% of high school class and scored over 18 on ACT. 85% or fewer of all applicants accepted.

Minimum difficulty: most freshmen were not in the top 50% of their high school class and scored somewhat below 19 on ACT. Up to 95% of all applicants accepted.

Open/non competitive: virtually all applicants accepted regardless of high school rank or test scores

ASSIGNMENTS/ACTIVITIES:

1. Identify colleges that match your ACT score: In **Learn Page**, click **School Finder**, click **Admissions Tab**, select your ACT range, click **Key Facts** and identify location of school (Midwest, northeast, by state, etc), click **See Your List of Schools** select college, click **Applied To** link in upper right corner
2. Identify colleges that offer your major: In **Learn Page**, click **Find Programs by Alphabetical List**, search for your major, then review list of schools.
3. After you identify your top colleges, go to Choices Planner, Learn Page, click on the **Add to Portfolio** link in the upper right corner.
4. Junior year college admissions wrap up: Identify a reach, target and safety school; Apply to reach, target and safety schools; Identify and apply for 3 scholarships (Go to the Learn Page and click Scholarship Finder); Visit the campuses.
